INTRODUCTION:			

The circular economy proposes a system that changes the current cycle of consumer habits. Instead, it focuses on a new model that reduces, reuses, or recycles waste. Not only is this beneficial for the environment, but it is also more economical! In today's world, finite resources are being extorted until depletion. Since the industrial revolution, the development model has been based on extracting resources to process and generate products, ultimately to then dispose of them. This has become known as a 'linear economy' and it is having exhaustive consequences on the environment.

In contrast, the circular economy aims to reuse and recover resources to extend the life cycle of products and lessen the raw extraction of materials. Implementing a circular economy approach, means revolutionising the current systems in place. The tourism sector has the power to develop a model that consumers can begin to follow. Moving towards a circular economy implies that the tourism industry can take advantage of; competitive advantages, cost reduction, reduction of energy consumption, CO2 emissions and the strengthening of its own supply chain.

The tourism sector is responsible for a significant percentage of greenhouse gas emissions, waste generation, the deterioration of local habitats, erosion, and degradation of the environment due to tourist activities. That is why sustainability has taken a primary role within the world agenda, both in the institutional, social, and private spheres. PROCESS
